RIDING TO A NEW CITY – MONTRÉAL 1975

MARC-ANDRÉ BROUILLARD

Montréal is considered one of North America's best cycling cities. But that hasn't always been the case. In 1975, cycling was a dangerous activity. You rode at your own risk. That year, more than 3,000 cyclists were injured, and 67 died in the province of Quebec. This had to stop. That same year, some twenty enthusiasts gathered in Montréal to create "Le Monde à bicyclette" (The World on Bike): What did these enthusiasts want? Safe bike paths everywhere, including bridges, dedicated parking lots, bike access to the subway, and so on. But they also wanted to question our mainly car-centric urban development, which eats away city budgets, pollutes and even kills! How were they to go about this? By transforming the streets of Montréal into a living theater!

Nous voulons des rues pour y vivre, pas pour y mourir.

Dans ce manifeste, je propose également cette idée folle. Et si la Ville achetait 10 000 bicyclettes pour les mettre à la disposition des Montréalais?

Les bicyclettes seraient dispersées un peu partout dans la ville. Les citoyens pourraient les emprunter en versant un dépôt et en présentant une pièce d'identité. Pas bête, non?

• Le 16 juin 1980, 11 jours après l'arrestation de Bob, le gouvernement québécois annonce qu'il veut investir 2 millions de dollars dans la création d'un réseau de pistes cyclables totalisant 280 kilomètres sur l'île de Montréal. L'axe Nord-Sud figure sur les tracés présentés ce jour-là.

• Le tout premier **TOUR DE L'ÎLE** à vélo, qui marque l'inauguration de la piste cyclable de l'est, longue de 58 km, se tient le 13 octobre 1985. Sur les 7000 cyclistes

inscrits, seulement 3500 se pointent en raison du mauvais temps, mais l'événement attire l'année suivante 15 000 participants.

• Le Tour de l'île devient l'un des événements emblématiques de Montréal. Reconnu par *Le Livre des records Guinness* comme le plus grand rassemblement de cyclistes dans le monde, il est organisé par Vélo Québec* et rassemble, de 1992 à 1997, des foules moyennes de 45 000 cyclistes.





Un après-midi, à l'heure du thé, la reine Victoria convoqua ses riches marchands au palais :
— Mes chers amis, je crois qu'il serait beaucoup plus profitable de céder ou de vendre toute cette Terre de Rupert à nos colonies d'Amérique qui songent à se confédérer* et à s'établir en dominion. Nous pourrions mieux nous enrichir, en ne pratiquant que le commerce*... et en leur laissant l'organisation et le gouvernement de ce territoire presque inhabité.
Ce qui fut fait.



Plus de dix années se sont écoulées*. Louis vit aux États-Unis. Il s'est marié avec Marguerite Monet. Ils ont deux enfants. Il « fait l'école » aux jeunes Métis de la Mission Saint-Pierre, un village francophone blotti dans les contreforts rocheux du Montana, pas très loin de la frontière canadienne.
Ce jour-là, sa classe est interrompue plus tôt que d'habitude par le grondement d'un petit convoi de voitures qui s'approche au trot. Une délégation*, conduite par Gabriel Dumont et mandatée par les Métis qui habitent les bords des rivières Saskatchewan et Qu'Appelle, vient solliciter son aide. Le gouvernement canadien n'a jamais tenu les promesses faites au Manitoba, et de nombreux Métis se sont réfugiés plus loin à l'ouest. Il faut que Louis revienne dans les Territoires. Lui seul peut rassembler tous les habitants et formuler adéquatement leurs demandes.



Bien qu'il ne soit toujours pas amnistié, Louis suit ses amis avec son épouse et ses enfants, Jean-Louis et Marie-Angélique. Ils se dirigent vers le village de Batoche, à trois semaines de voyage de la Mission Saint-Pierre. Sera-t-il en sécurité, lui dont la tête est mise à prix depuis tant d'années ?
« Le Nord-Ouest est ma mère patrie. Je suis sûr que ma mère ne me tuera pas ! »
Pourtant, Louis a peur pour les siens.



« Je le demande à tous ceux que les notions de la vérité et de la plus simple justice éclairent. Est-ce que l'honnêteté permet à un peuple plus grand de ravir à un peuple plus petit sa patrie ? La conscience humaine déclare qu'un tel acte est criminel. »
« La patrie est la plus importante de toutes les choses de la terre. L'enlever au peuple qu'elle a produit est aussi abominable que d'arracher une mère à ses enfants. Le peuple qui prend injustement à un autre peuple sa patrie commet le sacrilège le plus grand. Eh bien ! le gouvernement d'Ottawa est coupable de tout cela vis-à-vis des Métis. »
